

History and Location

Located on the little Swartkops River, Bethelsdorp was established in June 1803 by Dr Johannes Theodorus Van Der Kemp and was the first organised settlement in the Algoa Bay area, bar the military command post at Fort Frederick.



The British authorities looked upon such a mission as a means of reconciling with the Khoikhoi who had taken up arms against the colonial authorities and was established as a refuge for the destitute.

At the entrance of the reserve, one can still see the original historical treasures of the settlement.

The nature part of the Trail proceeds up the kloof into the Van Der Kemp's kloof Nature Reserve returning along the plateau through botanically interesting grassy Fynbos, with magnificent views across the Swartkops Valley and Algoa Bay.

Visitors to the Reserve can enjoy hiking trails, picnic areas, and stunning views of the indigenous vegetation and rugged valley. The Reserve is dedicated to protecting and preserving the unique flora and fauna of the Eastern Cape region and offers educational programs and opportunities for community engagement in environmental stewardship.

The Van Der Kemp's Kloof

Church: Erected by the Khoikhoi alongside reed and mud huts in 1803 (rebuilt in 1903 and 1926), and that still houses some of the treasured relics used by the

church. These include Van Der Kemp's Dutch Bible, the oldest in the country, printed in Holland in 1664, as well as his pulpit chair and baptismal font.



Mission Bell: Erected in 1815, The mission bell tower was used to bring order in the village or for special announcements, and it became a symbol of the mission's influence and authority in the area. Over time, the mission station grew and became a community activity hub. The bell tower remained a vital part of the mission's identity and was often used to mark significant milestones.



Livingstone Cottage: a Square stone house, reported to have hosted Dr David Livingstone in 1841.

Alms houses: Buildt in 1822 to accommodate the destitute and aided the crew from the London Missionary Society. Across from Alms houses in the bamboo reeds there are still wash basins to be found that was used to do linen and washing for Van Der Kemp.
