

# **History and Location**

Access to the Maitland Nature Reserve is via the Seaview Main Road to Maitland River Mouth, which comprises of dense indigenous coastal forest, abundant birdlife, and an old wagon road which used to be the access route to the Maitland lead mines.



The mines featured hidden tunnels within the thick vegetation that burrows deep into the hillside, forming a complex of man-made tunnels and a natural cave, home to thousands of bats residing alongside abandoned mining and drilling equipment.

The Reserve boasts a well-preserved
Coastal Dune Forest, with much of
the alien vegetation cleared to allow
indigenous flora to flourish. Keep your
eyes peeled for small buck species, Blue
Duiker, and Bushpigs.

As you stroll through the Reserve, the sea occasionally peeks through the trees, offering glimpses of the majestic
Southern Right Whales (present from August to October) and
Humpbacks (migrating from April to December).

- All plant and animal life is protected and must not be disturbed or harmed.
- · Please keep on the trail at all times.
- A minimum number of three persons is recommended as a safety precaution.
- · Please do not smoke or light fires while on the trail.
- · No dogs allowed.
- No mountain bikes allowed.
- Do not litter.
- · Carry at least two litres of drinking water per person.
